Program Overview

The SWS Community Welfare Program aims to connect underserved communities across Nepal with essential resources, institutional support, career guidance, and access to opportunities. In 2025, the program successfully expanded its reach to 22 districts across all seven provinces of Nepal.

Program Objectives

- Identify and support marginalized communities with limited access to institutions and services
- Facilitate connections between communities and relevant government bodies and NGOs
- Provide career guidance and professional development support to youth
- Promote awareness of available social welfare schemes and programs
- Build community capacity through workshops, training, and awareness campaigns

Key Activities Conducted

- Career guidance workshops for youth in remote districts
- Community needs assessment surveys across 22 districts
- Coordination with local government units (Palikas) for resource mapping
- Awareness campaigns on available government welfare schemes
- Facilitation of community members to relevant institutional services
- Volunteer mobilization and training sessions

Challenges Faced

- Difficult geographical terrain and limited road access in remote mountainous and rural districts
- Low awareness among communities about available government welfare schemes
- Limited human resources and volunteer retention in far-flung areas
- Coordination delays with some local government units
- Logistical difficulties in organizing regular monitoring visits due to seasonal weather conditions

Lessons Learned

Early Engagement	Early and continuous engagement with local government units significantly improves coordination and resource access.
Community-led Assessment	Community-led needs assessments yield more accurate and sustainable outcomes.
Volunteer Programs	Volunteer training and motivation programs are essential for maintaining consistent field presence.
Local Languages	Simple, localized awareness campaigns in local languages are more effective.

Impact and Outcomes

In 2025, a total of 2,940 individuals directly benefited from SWS interventions. Community feedback was encouraging, with many beneficiaries reporting improved access to information and basic services following SWS engagement.

The success of the program was made possible through strong collaboration with local government units, district-level NGOs, hospitals, educational institutions, and government line agencies. SWS extends sincere gratitude to all our partner organizations for their valuable cooperation and support.

Way Forward

Building on the achievements of 2025, SWS plans to gradually expand the Community Welfare Program toward covering more districts. We will focus on strengthening district-level coordination, improving volunteer networks, and exploring sustainable partnerships to increase our impact in the coming years.
